<u>The Dying:</u> Paul can be contacted at any time of the day or night in order to minister to the dying.



Halsall St Cuthbert's Report: May 2016

Admissions (September 2016)

Places in excess of 20 (the school's Admissions Number) may be available in the reception class following a restructure of the classes in the summer term. Staff are due to discuss this restructure imminently.

If anyone has been unsuccessful in initially gaining a place for their child at the school (ranked in the top 20) the next option is to appeal through the LEA. Any appeals however, will be ranked using the same agreed criteria. If anyone would like to initiate a formal appeal, please pop into school for further details and to collect a form.

School Budget

The school budget remains in a healthy state and we are confident that the present level of staffing will be in place through the new academic year from September 2016. This is vitally important to maintain the quality of our present provision and intensive support for each individual child.

New Tests

The children have been busy preparing for the new and even more challenging tests later this May. Let's hope that their efforts can be rewarded with some good results. It's what they deserve.

Swimming Gala

The swimming team did brilliantly well at the recent championships at Park Pool in Ormskirk. Altogether, we won 6 individual gold medals and 2 silver medals. What a haul! Thanks to Miss Hampson and Mrs Galley who helped supervise the children during the event.

Football Tournament

The boys' football team recently won the small school tournament at Ormskirk High. With a record of 6 wins and 2 draws, the team did incredibly well. Thanks to the parents who came along to support, the staff who helped to supervise on what were some extremely cold nights, and Mr Johnson and Mr Martin who helped prepare the lads with some expert coaching. It really made all the difference.

Trespassing on School Premises

We are still experiencing incidents where people are trespassing on the school site. This is sometimes people walking dogs and sometimes youngsters congregating around the school play areas. Equipment is still being damaged, dog mess is not picked up and often things such as bottles, cans, cigarettes, etc are discarded on the floor. It makes it much more difficult to keep the school premises safe for our children to play. If anyone has any information, please let us know as soon as possible. Thank you.

School / Church Partnership

Halsall Primary School and St Cuthbert's Church continue to work very closely together.

- Rev Paul is strongly involved in the life of the school and this is welcomed by
- governors, staff, parents and especially the children.
- Rev Paul's fortnightly worship is always a lively affair and there's also a termly Eucharist Service to which the whole school and church community is invited.
- Rev Paul also accompanies the school on its special Year 6 holiday every summer term.
- The school presents both the Harvest and Mothering Sunday Services in church and has a strong link to the Christingle Service at Christmas.
- As we have a good number of parents who wish their children to be confirmed each year, there are church volunteers who take sessions each week, to teach them all about the Christian religion and prepare them for the special Confirmation Service with the Bishop of Warrington. This is very much appreciated by staff and parents alike. (and the children as well, who get out of lessons for a short while).

- The school helps with fund-raising for the church and there is good communication through the parish magazine reports and the school newsletters.
- The church is also allowed free access to school premises throughout the year for its events and meetings.
- There continues to be a strong representation from the church on the Governing Body, members being endorsed by the Parish Council and Liverpool diocese.

Forced Academisation

The government has stated that all schools should be academies by 2020. This is a big risk. There is no justification to force schools to become academies as there is no evidence, even from OFSTED, that conversion improves the quality of education. In fact OFSTED states that many academy chains are performing badly and there is evidence to show that overall, LEA schools actually perform better.

When schools become academies the security of National Teachers Pay and Conditions will disappear, parents will lose their voice and any representation on the school's governing body, teachers will lose valuable preparation time, there will be detrimental effects upon maternity pay, leave of absence, paternity leave and sick pay. Schools won't need to appoint qualified teachers (QTS) and money will be lost in the system, similar to the NHS, paying senior management and executives, when it should be spent on the children in the classrooms with extra resources and quality staff.

Please consider the implications of such a radical change in our education system and how it may effect yourself for many, many years to come. Over £1-3bn (most of it on lawyers) will be spent on this forced academisation initiative.

Surely the government should be addressing the fact that :

- most schools are facing huge financial cuts
- * there is a huge and growing teacher shortage
- * there is a serious lack of pupil places in schools
- many school buildings are old and deteriorating fast
- there is curriculum chaos from the many rushed and poorly considered changes to National Curriculum and its assessment
- staff morale is extremely low and absence from stress is really high
- violent and disruptive behaviour in schools and the abuse of staff is all too frequent
- * It's likely to become much worse and those that suffer in the end, will be children.



Interpreting Nail Colours

Celebrity Foot Reader and Reflexologist, Jane Sheehan, has recently moved to Scarisbrick. Jane not only reads emotions and personality through the feet, but also interprets the colour of your nail varnish. So before you reach for that pot of Hot Pink, let's find out what your nail varnish says about you.

"Nails represent protection of the way you are thinking" says Jane, "so anything that happens to the nail indicates how you are dealing with outside influences. If you then choose to decorate the nail then you are advertising what you want to draw more of towards you" Jane shares with us her insight into what it means when you wear a colour on your toes and what it means when you wear that colour from head-to-toe.

Red

When I see red on the toe nails I am seeing someone who is ambitious or who wants strength and courage. Wear it when you feel tired or need extra energy.

Orange

Painting your toe nails orange signifies that you want to attract more fun and celebration into your life. It's the colour of excitement, playfulness and joy. Wear it when you want to be the life and soul of the party.

Yellow

Yellow toe nail varnish indicates alertness and optimism, someone who is bright, quick and full of curiosity. Wear it in small doses when you need to concentrate or when you need cheering up.

Green

Green toe nail colour indicates someone who wants to attract more calmness, tranquillity and harmony into their life. Wear it when you are feeling stressed or nervous about a situation

Indigo

Wear it when you want to achieve something difficult. This is the "just do it" colour. The person who wears this colour wants the determination to succeed.

Turquoise

"This is my favourite colour" says Jane. "If I see people wearing this colour I know they value freedom and independence." Wear it when you need inner confidence to succeed at something.

Blue

Blue is the colour for peace, integrity and honesty. Wear it when you need to speak up for yourself and keep your cool.

Magenta

Magenta on the nails makes me think of someone who wants to draw more nurturing or compassion into their lives. I often see this colour on people who are depressed (but it doesn't mean if you wear it you are depressed, rather it helps you to feel better about yourself). Wear it when you need to be organised, helpful or feel better about yourself.

Pink

Pink on the nails represents someone who wants to attract more love and affection into their life. Wear it when you want to feel loved, warm and protected.

Black

Black is often associated with mystery and potential. Wear it when you need to stand on your own two feet (pardon the pun!) and face your fears or to protect you from negative energy.

Brown

When I see someone with Brown varnish on the nails I think of someone who is reliable, down-to-earth and values comfort and security. Wear it when you need to feel safe or grounded and focused.

Gold

Gold allows us to be clear in our communication and positive in our actions and thoughts. Worn on the toe nails indicates wanting to attract more dignity. Wear it when you want to meet new challenges and sparkle!

Silver

Worn on the toe nails it indicates someone who is going through a period of reflection, trying to understand their feelings. Wear it when you need to resolve emotional disputes and stay calm

French Manicure

"I didn't used to have a reading for a French Manicure," says Jane, "But recently, I met a beauty consultant who observed that those of her clients who are perfectionists tend to choose a French manicure."

Gardener's Corner

May at-a-glance

May is, for me, one of the most exciting & loveliest months of the year in the garden, because you can see new flowers opening every time you step outdoors & the best of the year is still to come. Longer evenings and warmer weather brings out the gardener in all of us. Happy gardening.

General garden Tasks

Prepare the soil for bedding plants.

Keep on top of weeding & hoeing –its endless I know!

Watch out for and deal with pests using biological controls & organic remedies.

Feed established lawns if not done in April.

Pinch out any green shoots appearing on variegated trees & shrubs.

Tie in new growth of climbers & wall shrubs.

Clip beech, hornbeam, box & Leyland cypress late this month or early next. Cut privet. Support perennials.

Divide clumps of primroses & polyanthus after flowering.

Continue deadheading & feeding spring-flowering bulbs.

Plant & train sweet peas. Plant tubs, troughs, window boxes & hanging baskets in the middle of this month at the earliest.

Sow swede, beetroot, maincrop carrots, peas, radish & spring onion.

Direct-sow frost-tender vegetables, e.g. French & runner beans, sweetcorn & courgettes.

Harvest overwintered onions.

Water soft fruit bushes with swelling fruit & newly planted fruit trees.

Protect strawberries from birds.

Continue hardening off bedding plants ready for end of month outdoor planting. Plant tomatoes in early may & sweet peppers, chillies, melons & cucumbers late May.

Harvest baby potatoes.

Watch out for

Late frosts – protect with fleece.

Pests in the greenhouse & containers.

Divide overgrown water lilies in the pond.

Plants in their Prime

Rhododendrons. Clematis `Nelly Moser`. Clematis Montana. Viburnum. Dianthus. Wisteria. Euphorbia. Geum. Lonicera. Corydalis. Rosa `Lutea`. Tree peonies. Chaenomeles. Cotoneaster. Kerria japonica. Potentilla. Sambuscus nigra. Spiraea. Caellia.
