St Cuthbert's Church Spire update....

The work to finally stabilise the spire was finally completed in the Spring with the removal of the weathervane and a number of stonework courses before the temporary capping of the spire top. The spire now sports a substantial "wooden overcoat" which will hold the remaining stonework in place until the permanent solution is adopted. All of this initial work has been funded through the magnificent fundraising efforts of the Halsall community who to date have raised just over £20,000 in total.

Thank you so much to all who have given so far.

The fundraising journey, however, must continue to enable the full restoration of the spire to be completed and as part of this the Church has sought financial support from the Heritage Lottery Fund. The application included the repairs to the roof of the choir vestry as it is logical and more cost effective to carry out both repairs at the same time.

The Heritage Lottery Fund have agreed to support the work that is needed to develop the specification of works and the tender phases and ultimately will provide the Church with a grant of £240,400 towards the full cost of the repairs. In submitting this bid the Church has agreed to continue fundraising to support the overall costs and has accepted that it will further develop the heritage resources within the church environment. As part of this we intend to make a variety of historical records held within the church more accessible to the public using both modern day technology together with more traditional approaches.

There is still a considerable amount of work to be done as part of this phase and the likelihood is that we will not see any works starting before spring/summer 2015. In the meantime we will be continuing to redouble our fundraising efforts with more social events and through other unique ventures such as the recently published book "Curfew over the Moss" by Stephen Henders.

As and when further progress is made we will continue to report through this newsletter.

The Reader Writes

I do hope that you have enjoyed the summer break as I have. It's been quite hard work at times, I love looking after my grandchildren but there is no denying their boundless energy can be quite tiring. We've had some lovely outings and it was on one trip to Blue Planet in the play area that something struck me. Two little girls were having a bust up, screaming, shouting, pushing and shoving. Mum quickly intervened, calmed them down and made them say sorry to each other. They did it most reluctantly after much prompting and quite obviously didn't mean it at all! I realized then that we often say sorry as a matter of habit, but how often do we really mean it?

Sometimes it's easy to say when it's something minor, like bumping into someone in the supermarket or walking past someone you know well without saying hello, because your mind was elsewhere. When it becomes difficult is when we know we have done something deliberately wrong; firstly it can be really hard to admit a fault, but then it's so much harder sometimes almost impossible, to say sorry to someone you have hurt or offended. Most of us however hard it is will eventually swallow our pride, say sorry and make amends but this is never easy.

We so often grieve and hurt our Heavenly Father and when we come to church we say sorry for this in the general confession. But do we really mean it?

One definition of sorry is, a feeling of sadness, sympathy and disappointment for someone because we have caused something unpleasant to be done to them. Saying sorry to God and meaning it, then trying to do better is very important for our relationship with God and for our growth as Christians. At out Deanery Quiet day we were given a Celtic prayer for forgiveness; several people have asked for a copy, so here it is. I do hope you find it as good a way to say sorry to God as I do.

Gardener's Corner

September at-a-glance

Not so long ago, September was the end of the season – time to put the garden to bed- but not anymore. Mild autumns allow us to continue growing plants that slot into the summer border to give you another month or two of colour & interest. Happy Gardening.

General Tasks

Keep watering, feeding & deadheading – it does pay off!

Cut back any perennial stems that have finished flowering –like Iris Sibirica- to tidy garden.

Get the compost going – clearing generates a huge amount of waste.

Repair broken lawn edges, bumps & hollows.

Make new lawns from seed but delay laying turf till October.

Plant or move evergreens so the roots can establish before the first frosts.

Clip hornbeam, beech, Leyland cypress & thuja hedges before the middle of the month.

Cut slow growing yew & box hedges now if you only want to do the job once each year.

Plant spring flowering bulbs.

Replace summer bedding as it comes to an end with plants for winter & spring interest.

Deadhead & protect dahlias- but allow them to blacken with the first frost before lifting.

Collect seed from perennials.

Walk round the garden & move any perennials or shrubs that need a different position.

Watch out for early frosts & move any tender plants under cover.

Plant spring cabbage.

Cut down asparagus foliage once it has turned yellow or buff (it may occur next month)

Pot up herbs such as chives, mint, basil, coriander & parsley.

Continue harvesting blackberries, early apple varieties – pears at the end of the month.

Reduce the watering & feeding of all greenhouse plants.

Continue to feed fish until the weather breaks.

Give a final light thinning-out of oxygenating plants, but only if necessary.

EXPLORATORY DRILLING/FRACKING FOR SHALE OIL AND/OR GAS IN HALSALL

UPDATE

The Parish Council has been advised by Tesla that the proposed seismic survey in PEDL 164 has been postponed until 2015. However Aurora Exploration (UK) Ltd. have applied to Lancashire County Council for an extension of planning permission (LCC/2014/0095) at Norris Farm, Downholland Moss Lane, Formby until May 2016, where exploratory drilling has already taken place in the green belt.

The present government is openly committed to fracking and, to assist it, they are proposing to change the law of trespass to allow the exploration companies to carry out horizontal drilling under your home without your permission. There is an official government consultation on the subject online at:

The governments' stance is that extraction of shale oil and gas will be up and running by the end of this year. They maintain that it is for the good of the country and that it will bring money to local neighbourhoods. David Cameron has said:

"Companies have agreed to pay £100,000 to every community situated near an exploratory well where they're looking to see if shale gas exists. If gas is then extracted, 1 per cent of the revenue – perhaps as much as £10 million – will go straight back to residents who live nearby. This is money that could be used for a variety of purposes – from reductions in council-tax bills to investment in neighbourhood schools. It's important that local people share in the wealth generated by fracking."

It should be noted that residents in New York State opposed fracking even though they were offered 12.5%. The reason for this was due to the low yield of oil from fracking (less than 100th of conventional wells) which meant very little benefits to the community to offset the risk of environmental/structural damage even though the US government had not withdrawn the rights to individual compensation.

Your Parish Council would like to collate residents' views before the seismic survey takes place next year and a very short survey is overleaf.
