

A Note From The Retiring Editor

There is a long history of the Halsall Parish Magazine or Halsall News Magazine as it is now known. The first one in the archives (although I'm sure there were earlier editions in some format) is October 1959, 63 years ago. My grandfather Robert Heaton is named on the front page as Church Warden alongside Mr. W Leadbetter.

The first magazine I volunteered to compile alongside Chris Birks and Diane Marsh was in November 2013. A mere 9 years ago It is now time for me to step aside and a new editor, Chris Pyne is taking over the production of the Halsall News Magazine.

I would like to say a big thank you to all the contributors, advertisers, readers, and supporters of the magazine for the last 9 years. I know that Chris will do a great job and I wish him well in his new role.

The Barton Mission

Barton lies in the civil parish of Downholland within the ecclesiastical parish of Halsall. The Barton folk were more fortunate than most in the larger Halsall parish to have their church within a mile walk. Nevertheless, in the late 19th century the Count de Casteja gave a parcel of land to the people of Barton for a nominal rent and a mission church was constructed on Station road opposite Rock farm. This meant that the people of Barton could have their own church services. At this time Barton had a larger population than Haskayne. The Reverend Thomas Blundell Hollinshead Blundell the rector was instrumental in its construction.



The mission, constructed of corrugated iron, had an organ and furnishings. It was dedicated to St Oswald, an early Christian King whose head is depicted in the hands of Cuthbert on statues. Legend has it that Cuthbert lived at the same time as King Oswald and worked towards the objective of spreading Christianity. same Sometime after Cuthbert died his remains were taken to a shrine in Durham Cathedral. Legend has it that when the casket was opened the head of Oswald was found in the Saint's remains. The St Oswald's Mission was destroyed by fire on March 6th, 1965. At 11pm a villager noticed smoke and two fire appliances attended and fought for three hours to control the blaze but the interior was entirely destroyed. The Mission churchwarden at the time was Richard Ainscough, who held the view that faulty wiring under the corrugated iron sheets which formed

the base of the building, may have started the fire. The weather had turned to snow and blown in under the wiring.

This meant for church going locals that the centuries old tradition of a milelong trek to St Cuthbert's was renewed, albeit this time by bicycle and motor car. A window on the north side of the parish church depicts a detail of the mission etched in the stain glass. This window confirms the link between this parish outpost and the mother church and the engraving dates the mission from 1870 but there is no record of the mission until 1895. In the priest's vestry of St Cuthbert's, a surviving remnant of the stained glass from the mission survives in the window.

1938 Barton Rose Queen Festival

On the field, behind the Barton Mission, Barton held its annual Rose Queen festival beginning with a parade down Station Road from the Bluebell pub shown in the photo. By the 1930's there were three Rose Queen festivals in the parish. Haskayne had their Rose Queen day first, followed by Barton and finally Halsall. It is a wonder that they had enough children to participate but families were larger then and some children from the neighbouring villages would have participated in more than one parade.

Elizabeth Ambrose from Rock Farm was the Rose Queen in 1938. A crowning ceremony of the new Queen Elizabeth took place. John Haslam was the herald and Leonard Blundell the crown bearer. The ladies in waiting were Annie Sephton, Brenda Baybutt, Lily Sephton and Mary Huyton.



the roval procession arrived eight little girls made an arch way of rose staffs. These were Vera Marshall, Margaret Draper, Betty Baybutt, Jenny Aindow, Edna Blundell, Betty Carr, Doris Draper and Joan Aindow.

The Reverend Mather was in attendance, John Haslam was Master of Ceremony and tribute was paid to the

outgoing queen, Miss Betsy Sefton. Music was provided by the Barton jazz band with Harry Huyton as the leader of the group which included, William Haslam, John Ainscough, James Cheetham, Tom Balshaw, Phil Blundell, Leonard Stopforth, Victor Blundell, T Ainscough, George Hick, T Aindow and Harry Aindow.

Afterwards the Ormskirk Advertiser (7/7/38) reported a large crowd in attendance and a parade that included a brass band, a troupe of Morris dancers, a jazz band and several carts pulled by horses all decorated for the occasion.

New Councillor

The Council are pleased to welcome Keith Wright who was co – opted onto the Council at the meeting held on 8th June 2022.

Parking along Summerwood Lane

Car parking either side of Summerwood Lane at school times and when funerals and weddings are taking place at St Cuthbert's are causing an obstruction and prevent large vehicles, including the emergency services from passing through. Please use the Memorial Hall car park whenever possible.

Parking Along Moss Road

Car parking on pavements is causing problems along Moss Road. Can residents please park in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through.

Updates

The Parish Council were represented at Halsall Parish Jubilee event by Cllrs. Elizabeth Wright (Chair) and Andy Timon who took many photographs.

Funding for volunteers in various environmental groups, who maintain the beauty and tidiness of Halsall was agreed again for this year, as in previous years, at the June meeting of the Council and we thank them for all their hard work.

Earlier this year the Council also donated to the church to help fund replacement of the stolen flagstones.

A pathway, fencing and a gate are being installed on to the side of the Memorial Hall Playing Field running alongside Halsall Road jointly funded by Community Infrastructure Levy and Halsall Memorial Trust which will enable residents to avoid having to walk down Halsall Road on Remembrance Sunday and increase safety for the younger users of our playing field.

A healthy Halsall working group has been formed by your Parish Council to identify how we can help to promote health and wellbeing for us all as a Halsall Community.

Lettering on the plaques by the Memorial Gates are to be painted in time for Remembrance Sunday.

Reports of Dangerous Trees

The Parish Council has received concerns from residents via WLBC Councillor Denise Hirrell that there are dangerous trees on Halsall Memorial Playing Fields.

WLBC Arboricultural Officer Dave Thornber visited the site in April and a specialist contractor has also visited the site. There were no immediate concerns about the condition of any of the trees surrounding the Playing Fields. Neither contractors nor West Lancashire Borough Council have the right to enter neighbouring properties to conduct more detailed inspections but our neighbours assured us that their trees are regularly inspected.

A programme of work to prune trees will commence later this year after planning permission for protected trees has been approved and it is the correct season to prune appropriate tree varieties.





Gardener's Corner

July & August at-a-glance

July is peak flowering time for most gardens, while August is the culmination of months of effort. The garden is a paint box of summer colour, herbaceous borders zing with colour, bedding plants are blooming fit to bust & hanging baskets are full to the brim & in full swing.

And if you fancy a change of scene, it's a great time to go garden visiting.

Summer is here – enjoy. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Raise the cutting height of the lawn mower blades during hot dry spells.

Avoid watering the lawn, except a new lawn in long dry spells.

Prune & deadhead roses.

Prune philadelphus & wisteria.

Clip privet & other fast-growing hedges.

Continue taking softwood cuttings of shrubs.

Cut lavender for drying.

Keep on top of deadheading plants & perennials.

Divide old clumps of bearded irises & replant.

Plant autumn flowering bulbs.

Sow maincrop carrots, early peas, turnips, lettuce, radishes & spring cabbages.

`Stop` outdoor tomatoes.

Cut & dry or freeze herbs.

Tidy strawberry beds & grow spare plants from runners.

Harvest raspberries, redcurrants, blackcurrants & gooseberries.

Train a standard fuchsia.

Water & feed greenhouse plants more often now the weather is hotter & the containers are filling up with roots.

Provide more oxygen in ponds if necessary by thinning waterweeds or running a fountain.

Divide water iris.

Watch out for

Cabbage white butterflies laying eggs on brassica plants.

Potato blight on potatoes & tomatoes.
