The Rector Writes



What sort of memories do you have from Christmas past? For me, as a child, the excitement certainly started when the Christmas tree, with all its baubles, lights and tinsel, was brought down from the attic. That was usually around mid-December and it marked the start of a time when everything was just that little bit different and normal routines were laid aside for a while. My parents enjoyed some time off work and family members gathered at our house for Christmas dinner. It was, of course, great to be off school as well!

Maybe that was not a very holy view of Christmas, but it does make me think now of one very important aspect of the incarnation (God being born and living with us on earth). When Jesus came into the world, he came *to make a difference*. Whether he truly understood just what an impact he would make we can only guess at, but in the end he changed things so much that the majority of the world now measures dates and seasons based on the time of his birth.

With this in mind, it seems right that the way we mark Christmas should be special, allowing us to depart from our daily routine. For some that means more partying, but even amongst the rowdiest of parties the name of Christ is uttered without shame or embarrassment (even if it is not obvious to all that he is what 'Christ-mass' is all about!). For others it might mean a trip to the local church to join in with some carols at one of our services. Even for those already committed, it means worshipping at different times and with the crib always in view, bringing home that message that "God so loved his world that he sent his only son to be born and die for each of us."

Christmas should be different, but we must go beyond simply marking it out as a special season. If Jesus came to make a difference, it is up to us to make sure that we too make a difference in the world. And the world today, more than ever, needs to hear a different message that speaks of peace, mutual respect and hope not anger, division and hopelessness.

May the peace of Christ dwell in you this Christmas time and be your inspiration in the coming year; Susan

Halsall Bees and Butterflies Brigade

A big thank you to all those of you who joined our meetings during the autumn to take action for nature: In November we planted early-flowering crocus and dainty species tulip in the grassy area of St. Cuthbert's Memorial Garden, aiming to help bees find nectar as they emerge from hibernation next year. Exciting plans are already being laid for 2024 and we are keen to get more of the local community involved, so please watch out for details of our next meeting in future issues.

Sadly, the need to help nature is urgent. Many of the well-loved insects, birds and mammals of our british countryside are in desperate trouble. Song thrushes and hedgehogs are classed as vulnerable and in danger of extinction. Our bees and other pollinating insects are in serious decline and our rivers are polluted. But all is not lost yet – nature can recover if we all play our part and give it a helping hand.

So, what can be done to be kind to nature at this time of year? I know it's wet and blustery, daylight is scarce and it's the season to be in by the fire. Well, if you have a garden (and I know many of you have lovely gardens in Halsall) you are totally justified in leaving it alone for the winter months – in fact, all the little creatures that hibernate in the fallen leaves and plant stems will thank you for being left undisturbed until spring.

If you have a garden and you feel the need to do something constructive over the winter, the best thing you can do is plant a tree. Bare-rooted trees are available from now until March and can be cheaper to buy than potted trees. Hawthorn, Crabapple and Rowan (Mountain Ash) are three of the best types of tree for small-to-medium gardens and they are all fantastic for wildlife, bearing both blossom and fruit. If you're not sure where to buy trees, drop me a line at the email address below and I'll be able to give you some pointers.

If you have an established garden, use the winter months to think and plan.

Could you make one simple change to your garden- or the way you garden - to help some wildlife to thrive? If you are keen to make changes but need ideas to move forward, have a look at The Lancashire Wildlife Trust's website. Click "Get Involved" and you'll find loads of ideas and information to help you get started. Remember you don't have to do everything you read about – just one small action will make a huge difference to nature.

Finally, if you'd like to make your garden more wildlife-friendly but can't decide how to make a start, I'd be more than happy to help with ideas, advice or a visit to have a chat with you. Please do get in touch so that we can make a difference With best wishes to you all,

During this past year we have made considerable progress on the Green. We now have two sheds, which have proven invaluable for storing tools and having tea and coffee in when then the weather turns inclement. The beds and pots all looked spectacular this year, including a new raised bed for the shrubs that will reduce risks from flooding and a new corner plot.

We bought a couple of new ducks for the pond, but unfortunately, they disappeared after a few weeks, so we will just enjoy the company of the frogs, fish and moorhens for now.

Halsall Proud & Tidy Group

The results of Lancs Best Kept Village Competition are in and we are pleased to announce that we have two runner-up awards in the outstanding features section. The village bakehouse was praised for their floral displays and was just beaten to first place by Henshaws butchers in Aughton. The cricket grounds were praised for being very well kept and were beaten to first place by Mawdesley cricket club. Congratulations to both entries and our thanks for putting in the effort for making such a difference to our village.

We were placed 5th out of 8 in whole village champion class, the winners being Elswick and Blacko. Here are the 2 sets of judges reports –

Judge 1

<u>OVERALL IMPRESSION</u> Halsall is a village with mature roadside trees and residential houses which are well maintained with tidy gardens and hedges which give an overall well cared for impression. Entering the village from both directions you are greeted with colourful and well maintained planters. These are also found throughout the village along with the hanging baskets. The roadside gutters were clear of weeds and there were no signs of graffiti or litter within the village. The hedges were trimmed back from the pavements to allow easy movement for pedestrians. This is obviously a village which takes pride in it's appearance and community involvement.

<u>WHAT MAKES IT BEST KEPT</u> The entrance and pathway to St. Cuthbert's Church and the War Memorial had been enhanced with the planting of red flowers which made them striking features. The children's painted stones around the memorial hinted at the involvement of the children of the village.

The Bishops Walk Nature Reserve is a thriving haven for nature and St. Cuthbert's School was well maintained with exciting activities for the children. The notices (including a Best Kept Village notice) were clear and up to date. The post box was painted as was the telephone box and we particularly enjoyed seeing the telephone box gentleman! The seating area within the village was tidy and welcoming.

The cricket ground, Memorial Hall and Village Bakehouse were well cared for. Notices were up to date and showed their community use. The planters and hanging baskets enhanced the setting of the buildings and particularly the Bakehouse displays. The cricket ground itself was well maintained as were commercial premises opposite the church.

<u>AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT</u> As an outstanding feature we felt the Sarcen's Head could be improved by removing the weeds from the pavers around the entrance and also the removal of dead plants from their planters and replacing with new ones. The children's play areas showed signs of rotting wood and this may well need addressing. There was a broken bench and signage at the entrance was faded and would benefit from being replaced.

The notice board within the bus shelter was faded and the surface was cracked. It may be possible to get in touch with the bus company to have this replaced.

Judge 2

<u>Overall Impressions</u> It was very evident that this is a vibrant village where the residents take a great deal of pride in it's appearance and welcome. On the first visit it was very difficult to find anything negative to say as it was immaculate and comes across as a very happy place to live. Unfortunately on our second visit we did spot some isolated pieces of litter which sadly impacted a perfect score.

<u>What makes it Best Kept</u> Some great local amenities including very well kept fields/cricket grounds and excellent well equipped and maintained children's playgrounds. The village hall was obviously very well used and maintained to a high standard. We were particularly impressed with Bishops Walk Nature Area adjacent to the school.

Areas for improvement Keeping litter free and clearing roadside weeds would improve the overall score

We think the marks must have been very close indeed for us to be placed 5^{th} when the judges remarks were very good on the whole. Bring on next year!!



Planning Applications



Gardener's Corner

December & January at-a-glance

The garden is magical in winter. The colour palette is limited, but the strong shapes & skeletal framework provide its own kind of beauty & don't forget the garden can be a great source of home-grown material for a natural feel to Christmas decorations in & outside the home. Happy Christmas & Happy Gardening.

General garden tasks

Continue winter digging if soil is workable.

Plan & begin any landscaping jobs.

Clear away any debris to prevent harbouring slugs & snails.

Rake up the last of the leaves.

Send off for seed catalogues to browse through on darker rainy days.

Carry out lawn repairs if weather conditions allow.

Move or plant deciduous trees or shrubs if the soil is workable.

Prune ornamental vines.

Cut shoots for indoor decorations.

Organise your Christmas tree.

Sow seeds of hardy plants.

Plant seasonal outdoor tubs & hanging baskets for Christmas.

Plant fruit trees & bushes.

Continue to check stored fruit.

Tidy plants in the greenhouse & continue to water sparingly.

Check any bulbs in store.

Check tubs planted with bulbs for mice disturbance.

Make provisions to prevent pond from freezing over.

Clear up the shed, clean tools, wash pots & trays – spring will be here before you know!

Watch out for

Chilled pot plants – pot plants that have been standing in the open outside shops may have come straight from a warm & sheltered greenhouse. Poinsettias are especially vulnerable.

Prunus `Autumnalis`. Viburnum. Mahonia. Japonica. Cotoneaster. Fatsia. Malus. Photinia. Pyracantha. Skimmia. Clematis `freckles`. Jasmine varieties. Winter flowering pansies.


