The Rector Writes

If I had a pound for everyone who tells me, I only work Sundays I would be able to give a significant amount to the fundraising efforts for St Cuthbert's! Being a priest is an amazingly varied role. No two days are the same. I can go from taking a school assembly to visiting someone who cannot get to church. I can spend time sorting out the inevitable paperwork associated with running a church to the joy of a baptism visit or the sadness of a funeral visit.

Then there are the unexpected and unplanned encounters with so many amazing and interesting people. All have a story to tell and information to give me about the village and its history. I still feel like I have much to learn, as I prayerfully spend time with you all.

July is a time when many of us think about taking a break. School will break up for the long summer vacation and say goodbye to our longstanding headmaster Mr Scholes. He will be sorely missed. I know plans are already underway to find a new head. That is one of the amazing things about village life, each of us is a temporary custodian of the place and its stories and it is our role to hold them gently and pass them on when we move on. Mr Scholes will pass on a successful well loved and well resourced school to his successor in due course.

I have been reading about St Cuthbert over the last few months. He lived in the seventh century, a time of great upheaval and uncertainty, not that dissimilar to today. 



Planning Applications

Plex Lane Bus Stop Shelter

Council reviewed the decision on the bus shelter following confirmation that there is a lease until 2030. The roof has been repaired, the frame strengthened, and the outside been repainted. Thank you to everyone who commented on Facebook in support of retaining the bus stop shelter.

St Aidan's Hall

The kitchen at St Aidan's Hall was recently inspected by West Lancs Environmental Health department and retains its 5-star category. The training, processes and facilities provided by Shirdley Hill Community Association in supporting the regular Luncheon Club were also inspected and successfully passed. Report from Traffic & Road Safety Group

Councillors are continuing with a phased approach to reporting all outstanding potholes and damaged signs on a street by street basis. Several repairs were reported for Renacres / Heathey Lane area and majority of these have been resolved. Anyone can report potholes or damaged signs via the LoveCleanStreets app on your mobile phone.

Accounts and Auditing

The Council is required to display a summary of its accounts on the website and all 5 noticeboards. Residents have the right to inspect the detailed accounts between 3rd June and 12th July by arrangement with the Parish Clerk. See page 22.





The Bees and Butterflies Brigade (July 2024)

Thank you to all of you who have been inspired by our meetings to include extra plants for pollinators in your own garden — you are amazing people and your gardens are more important than ever in the fight to save our wild bees. Whilst native wildflowers in the right location are undoubtedly fantastic for bees, we must not forget that our pollinating friends are equally grateful for the food that garden plant varieties afford.

In my garden, certain plants stand out as powerful bee-magnets in the summer months. Sea hollies (Eryngium), Cone flowers (Echinacea), African lilies (Agapanthus) and Beardtongue (Penstemon) all attract pollinators to feast on the nectar whilst providing a border full of colour, too. Purple top vervain (Verbena bonariensis) and Globe thistles (Echinops) will heave with bees and attract to the beautiful insects such as butterflies and moths too. All these plants thrive in a sunny, partly-sheltered border on moist but well-drained soil; they are alive with sound and movement on a sunny day and bring me so much pleasure.

Whilst it is fantastic to plant for pollinators in your garden, the way you look after your plants can have a positive impact on their ability to support insects. If a plant is thirsty and stressed by summer heat, it will put its resources into surviving rather than reproducing. This means it will produce less flowers than usual and therefore less pollen and nectar, leaving pollinators hungry. By keeping your pots and borders well-watered through the summer months, you will be helping your plants to provide as much food as possible for our pollinators. Add a dose of water-soluble plant food, too, and you will receive an abundance of colour as a reward!

Dead-heading certain plants is a great way to maximise flowering. By taking off the spent flowers, you can prompt the plant to respond with another flush of blooms. In my garden, July is the time to dead head plants such as perennial salvias and veronica, which are covered with bees in June. If I dead head them now, they re-flower by the end of August and into September, which is a real bonus for me and the bees. I also cut my catmint and hardy geraniums quite hard after they have flowered, removing much of the foliage down to shoots of new growth — with a water and a feed they re-grow fresh foliage and re-flower later in the summer.

Where shrubs are concerned, summer pruning can be useful to shape them and help them cope with periods of drought. It can also help certain shrubs flower prolifically in the following year, however, maximizing the plant's potential to help pollinators. I have a beautiful Mock Orange in my garden (Philadelphus) which I trim back with secateurs every July, after it has flowered. The trimming reduces it in size, keeping it manageable, but I also remove about a third of the main stems right to the ground. I'm rewarded each summer by fresh, strong growth, beautiful scented flowers and my insect friends.

If you'd like to find out more about the maintenance of flowering plants, or you just want to ask about a specific plant you have in your garden, do come along to our next meeting and have a chat with us. Whether you are an experienced gardener or just a beginner, we'd love to meet you. Join us on Saturday 20th July at 10am for a maintenance session at Bridge 25 near The Saracens Head – we'll be learning about the new planting there and what it needs to establish and thrive. In the meantime, enjoy your garden.
